The meeting started at 4:00 pm. The minutes from the December meeting were approved on the motion of Carie Allen and seconded by Kayleigh Baker. The motion was carried.

Laura Osborne opened with the introduction of NADAA’s interns, Meagan Wood and Trisha Ondracek. Meagan and Trisha are students at Peru State College. Meagan is majoring in Psychology and Trisha is majoring in Criminal Justice and minoring in Psychology. They have been very helpful with the concession stand and are currently working on the upcoming prescription drug awareness campaign. Meagan and Trisha are a great asset to NADAA and we are looking forward to our time with them.

The winter banquet was a success! Having pre-paid tickets seemed to help with attendance and there was a break in the weather that made it possible. Winter banquet planning committee member Carie Allen thought the banquet went well.

Last winter, the Auburn PTO put on a family fun night luau. NADAA provided aid in the form of manpower. This year, the PTO has asked NADAA for assistance in the form of funding as well as manpower. They have asked for a donation of \$80 to purchase supplies and prizes. Laura has requested a complete list of purchases and stated that a NADAA donation would be in the form of a reimbursement, not money up front. This is a great opportunity to get Safe Homes information to elementary parents as well as keep up our relationship with the PTO. Carie Allen moved that NADAA donate up to \$80 and participate in the PTO luau and Mary-Jo Parker seconded the movement. The motion was carried.

The DFC continuation grant is due at the end of February, and the NADAA staff would appreciate help writing it. It will not be as big of a challenge as previous grants have been, as we have much of the information necessary. Most of the work will be updating the information. Kayleigh reported that YADA is currently working on the banners they requested funding for. The goal is to have the banner done by the end of February.

There are many ways to accumulate these hours. Some examples are: trash pick-up, YADA meetings, coalition meetings, 5th quarters, Red/White Tailgate, concessions, and YADA times. In addition, students must attend at least four of the next nine YADA meetings scheduled and must contribute at least one of the 35 hours to the YADA banner, YADA Times or brochures.
